The Dolomiti Superbike delivers Gold!

The 'Gold prize' is understandably a revered goal for all the cyclists to achieve. At the 15th meeting of the Südtirol Dolomiti Superbike competition, Hobby bikers from 26 Nations can participate and pedal for one of the esteemed honours which in the case of this event, is a Golden GT Mountain-bike.

There is only one golden GT Bike available in Italy. The event organiser and manager Kurt Ploner explained that this prize is exclusively open to all Hobby bikers and cycling enthusiast who take part on 12 June 2009. The overall amateur winner of the long distance contest gets to take the bike home. Various categories are welcome to take part in this grouping except professionals; the elite and U23 cyclists.

The bike frame is made from a Monocoque-Carbon; possesses a 100mm spring deflection and has a Shimano XTR-Grouping. After GT Bicycles launched a limited edition of the GT Golden Race Series in April 2009, cyclists from around the globe scrutinised its performance which resulted in it becoming one of the most sought after bikes. "Only the fastest contender can win this coveted prize and it's not purchasable", assured the organising committee.

The race track has been provisionally signposted and is accessible for testing. Roel Paulisson, the present MTB-Marathon World Champion has covered the long distance with his mountain bike. He found the conditions to be perfect with the sun having assisted with the snowmelt. The completed race signposting will be in place one week prior to the main event. The tourist industry has certified an availability of accommodation for 5 000 bikers including families for the duration of the racing period and to date a total of 2 900 entrants have been received.
