### Südtirol Dolomiti Superbike Junior and Special Event

The 15<sup>th</sup> Südtirol Dolomiti Superbike will again attach special importance to children and physically challenged athletes this year. The Junior and Special Superbike will be held on Saturday, on the eve of the Superbike race.

The Junior Race will start from the main square in Niederdorf at 4 p.m. Last year, more than 270 young cyclists from several nations took part in the course which ranged from 6 to 1 km depending on the age group. This year, youngsters born from 1991 onwards will again have the opportunity to compete in the exciting race. Over 16s are even allowed to take part in the short Superbike event; over 18s in the long-distance event. Competitors can register for the race in the organising committee's office on the main square or by internet until Saturday, 11 July. Any rideable two-wheel vehicle is permitted. The fans along the course will play an important role in the race. They'll be the ones to cheer on and accompany the biking champs of tomorrow.

The Special Dolomiti Superbike will be held for physically challenged athletes on Saturday at 2 p.m. The event was organised for the first time last year and went down extremely well. The organisers again look forward to welcoming deaf, blind and physically challenged sportsmen and women to the event. They will complete a 10-km course which will start and finish at the main square in Niederdorf. The race will be coordinated by Herbert Alber, representative of sports for the physically disabled in VSS (Association of South Tyrolean Sports Clubs).
